New Eyes E-Voucher program change. Effective April 1, 2024, a \$10 non-refundable application fee will now be assessed when each eyeglass application is submitted. This payment can be made with any major credit or debit card, pre-paid credit card, or PayPal. The application fee is the same for every individual, irrespective of the type and difficulty of the prescription.

### Eligibility Guidelines

- Be in financial need - reside in a household with net monthly income below 250% of US Poverty Guidelines.
- Have had a recent eye exam (within the last 24 months). A current copy of the prescription is required.
