

WHAT A DIFFERENCE A DAY MAKES

ON ANY GIVEN DAY, Pioneer provides a chance for change to approximately 2,748 people at nearly 60 locations across the state.

COUNSELING & TREATMENT

458 adults receive counseling for substance use disorders or mental health issues

172 adults receive residential substance use disorder treatment

91 adults receive sobering services

46 families with children receive intensive in-home counseling aimed at family preservation and reconciliation

19 adults receive detoxification treatment

13 adults receive intensive treatment for co-occurring mental health and substance use disorder issues

HOUSING

327 adults and **25 families with children** live in transitional, clean and sober housing

243 adults and **47 families with children** have permanent, affordable housing

142 adults with chronic mental illness or significant disabilities receive assisted care

71 homeless veterans receive housing and support services

JOB TRAINING & EMPLOYMENT

450 adults with a criminal history or past substance use disorder are employed by Pioneer

19 adults receive job search readiness and soft skills development training

12 adults receive occupational training in manufacturing and food service

100 adults are engaged in follow-up services

SUPERVISION & RESIDENTIAL REENTRY

16 youth receive residential counseling to address extreme behavioral problems and mental health issues

17 youth without legal documentation have temporary housing pending a federal immigration hearing

11 at-risk youth get secure residential care and crisis-intervention from homelessness and domestic abuse

454 adults reside in state work release and federal reentry centers and receive help finding employment and other support services to successfully transition back into their communities

87 adults are supervised on home confinement or day reporting status
