*Representative able to assist UHC members releasing or recently released from incarceration get connected to services, resolve issues or answer coverage questions.*
- **DVS of Snohomish County 11:00am - 1:00pm (May 12<sup>th</sup>)**  
*Domestic Violence Services of Snohomish County will be available to answer questions about DVS & the wide ranges of services provided to survivors of abuse.*
- **Employment Navigation (TRAC Associates.) 1:00pm - 4:00pm (May 5<sup>th</sup> & 19<sup>th</sup>)**  
*Individualized employment services to support eligible individuals overcome barriers in obtaining and maintaining employment.*

- **Lifeline Program – SIM Cards 10:30am - 2:30pm (May 13<sup>th</sup> & 27<sup>th</sup>)**  
*A Lifeline representative will be on-site to determine eligibility for enrollment. If eligibility requirements are met, a Lifeline SIM Card will be issued enabling free monthly phone service for your household. Please bring proof of eligibility (i.e. benefit award letter, etc.) SIM cards are compatible with GSM unlocked devices. \*Note: Devices are not included.*
- **North Sound 211 (VOA) 12:00pm-2:00pm \*Service not available May 6<sup>th</sup>\***  
*Individuals can meet with a Community Resource Advocate from 211, who will assess their needs and match them with available services in their area.*
- **Behavioral Health/Supportive Svcs. (Helping Hands Project Org.) 11:00am - 1:00pm**  
*Agency offers support for individuals facing mental health challenges and/or substance abuse. Services include intensive case management, housing assistance BH counseling, and more. Eligibility criteria must be met to access service.*
- **Employment Navigation (Orion) 11:00am-1:00pm (May 13<sup>th</sup> & 27<sup>th</sup>)**  
*Individualized employment services to support eligible individuals overcome barriers in obtaining and maintaining employment.*
- **LifeSet Program (Youthnet) 1:00pm-3:00pm**  
*LifeSet offers free support services to youth aged 17.5 up to 22 years, residing in Snohomish County. Clients receive 1-on-1 comprehensive support to target goals in areas, such as housing, employment, community resources, and so much more. Young adults transitioning from state services, or experiencing challenges with meeting basic needs are eligible.*
