Eyeglass applications accepted
Monday-Friday 9am -3pm

New Eyes purchases new prescription eyeglasses for low-income individuals in the U.S. through an e-voucher program. A \$15 nonrefundable application fee is payable when each eyeglass application is submitted.

Eligibility Guidelines:

- Be in financial need - reside in a household with net monthly income below 250% of US Poverty Guidelines.
- Copy of current prescription from a recent eye exam (within the last 24 months)

Application Procedure:

- Bring unexpired eyeglass prescription to **Carnegie Resource Center**.
- Fill out E-voucher application.
- Select eyeglass frames.
- If approved, glasses will be delivered within 5-7 business days.

 Screening and assessment for veterans experiencing homelessness. Support is provided to access resources and to develop action plans to address identified needs.
