Flood Recovery Support and Resources

- [Food benefit additional relief program](#) - An additional relief program is available for Washington residents in King, Lewis, Pierce, Skagit, Snohomish and Whatcom counties. Gov. Bob Ferguson has allocated \$ 2.5 million to our colleagues at the state's Military Department Emergency Management Division for Individual Assistance Needs Grants to further help people impacted by the severe flooding in Washington.

People can apply for this limited assistance starting Friday, Jan. 2, 2026, in three ways:

1. Online at the Salvation Army website (SAHelp.org), which the Military Department is contracting with
2. By phone at 833-719-4981
3. In person at a Disaster Assistance Center in the county where the resident lives

- [Flood recovery support for farmers](#) - USDA Farm Services Agency (FSA) has several emergency relief programs that can help with post-flood recovery. To qualify for this coverage:

1. Contact your local FSA office at the first sign of damage. Damage reports are needed to request funding for the Emergency Conservation Program (ECP), so please report early, even if you only have general information to share at this point. If your farm is not already registered with USDA, they can help start that process.

2. Document damage or losses with photos that are date stamped (phone cameras do this automatically).

Apply for REDUCED-COST Glasses

New Eyes helps low-income individuals in the U.S. obtain new prescription eyeglasses through its e-voucher program. Each application requires a nonrefundable \$15 fee, payable with any major credit, debit, or prepaid card. The fee is the same for all applicants, regardless of prescription type or complexity. Eligible children may receive up to two pairs of eyeglasses every 12 months. Optional upgrades are available at an additional cost.

Eligibility Guidelines:

- Must demonstrate financial need (residing in a household with a net monthly income below 250% of U.S. Poverty Guidelines).
- Provide a copy of a valid eyeglass prescription from an eye exam conducted within the last 24 months.

Application Procedure:

- Bring unexpired eyeglass prescription to Carnegie Resource Center.
- Fill out E-voucher application.
- Select eyeglass frames.
- If approved, glasses will be delivered within 5-7 business days.

Ride Free to Cold Weather Shelters



Community Transit & Everett Transit provide free rides to cold weather shelters whenever they open due to cold weather conditions.

How it works:

- Riders can use any Community or Everett Transit bus when traveling to a designated cold weather shelter.
- No special pass or ticket is required—just let the driver know you're headed to a cold weather shelter.
- Transit service is available during regular operating hours, when cold weather shelters are open.
- Policy applies to DART and Paratransit trips.
- Policy applies to Community Transit Zip vehicles (within service area)

Coordinated Entry

A system for individuals and families experiencing or at imminent risk of homelessness

Access the Coordinated Entry system by calling **2-1-1** to speak with an Information and Referral Specialist.

Who is eligible?

Individuals or families experiencing literal or imminent homelessness are eligible for Coordinated Entry.

Literally homeless: A person who is sleeping outside, in a shelter, or somewhere not meant for human habitation. Persons who are literally homeless will be referred to a Resource Navigator.

Imminently homeless: A person who will be losing the housing they currently have in 14 days or less. Persons who are imminently homeless will be referred to a Prevention Navigator.

The Navigator will receive the referral from 2-1-1 and contact you to set up an appointment.



Eligible households can access Coordinated Entry for homeless prevention and housing assistance through uniform screening, assessment, and prioritization. Support is provided to access resources and to develop action plans to address identified needs. Immediate housing resources are limited.

Dial 2-1-1 from anywhere in Washington State to receive information about resources and services available in your area. There are several Coordinated Entry service sites throughout Snohomish County and walk-in services may be available depending on location. 2-1-1 can provide information about the Coordinated Entry service location nearest to you. *Public health recommendations may limit in-person services.*

Frequently Asked Questions

Can I use Coordinated Entry to get immediate placement into a housing program?

Unfortunately, no. There are very limited Snohomish County housing programs available for those who need it. Many community housing resources are not filled through Coordinated Entry. These include emergency shelter, affordable housing, senior and disabled housing, Section 8 programs, and chemical dependency treatment-based housing programs. Coordinated Entry will allow you to meet with a Navigator to determine whether you are eligible for specific housing programs and other possible resources and housing solutions.

Can a Navigator tell me how long it will take to get housing through a certain program?

No. All of the housing programs served through Coordinated Entry are NOT accessed on a “first come, first served” basis. Households are prioritized for programs based on an assessment. Some households will be placed before others, regardless of who contacts Coordinated Entry first. The best course of action is to work with your Navigator to identify solutions outside of the homeless housing system.

Do navigation services vary from agency to agency?

No. While some agencies serve specific populations, all Coordinated Entry agencies follow the same policies and procedures. All Navigators utilize the same screening tool to assess your needs. Navigators will work with you to identify and resolve barriers to housing stability by providing direct referrals to tailored services.






