Representative able to assist UHC members releasing or recently released from incarceration get connected to services, resolve issues or answer coverage questions.
- **Orca LIFT Cards (LCSNW) 10:00am-1:00pm**
Enrollment representatives available to issue Orca cards to qualified individuals.

DSHS Everett CSO representatives available for applications, reviews, changes, ID vouchers, and assistance for the following programs: Basic Food Assistance, Cash Assistance, Medicare Savings Program and Disability Medical Assistance.
- **Veterans - Homeless Patient Aligned Care Teams (HPACT) 9:00am - 11:30am**
HPACT team consists of an MD and Social Worker that work with unhoused veterans who are VA healthcare eligible wanting to get connected w/primary care at the VA.
- **Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing (HUD-VASH) 9:00am - 12:00pm**
HUD-VASH provides permanent supportive housing for eligible homeless Veterans. To be eligible Veterans need to be homeless or chronically homeless & meet income requirements. HUD-VASH is a collaborative program that pairs HUD's Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) rental assistance with VA case management and supportive services.
- **Veterans - Coordinated Entry (SnoCo) 10:00am - 12:00pm**
Screening and assessment for veterans experiencing homelessness. Support is provided to access resources and to develop action plans to address identified needs.
- **Veteran Assistance Program (SnoCo) 10:00am - 12:00pm**
A representative will be available to meet veterans seeking assistance. Learn more about federal VA benefits and programs and eligibility criteria for Veterans' Assistance Funds.

- **Veterans Community Employment Coordinator (VA-HVCES) 10:00am - 11:30am**
Assistance for Veterans experiencing or at risk of homelessness achieve stable employment by providing career guidance, job search assistance, resume and interview support, and connections to training and employers. These services are designed to promote long-term financial stability, housing retention, and self-sufficiency.
- **Orca LIFT Cards (LCSNW) 10:00am-1:00pm (Sept 8th & 22nd)**
Enrollment representatives available to issue Orca cards to qualified individuals.

- **Naloxone Giveaway (Evergreen Recovery Centers) 10:00am - 2:00pm (Sept 22nd)**
Evergreen Recovery Centers HOST Program will be on-site to distribute 2 Nasal Naloxone Kits (aka Narcan) to each individual who attends.
- **Lifeline Phone Program – Phones & SIM Cards 10:30am - 2:30pm**
Get connected through the Lifeline Program! Phones are \$25, with optional upgrades available. FREE SIM cards require on-site activation with a compatible unlocked device. A VALID PHYSICAL PHOTO ID IS REQUIRED—copies, screenshots, photos, or emailed IDs are not accepted. Bring a current benefit letter, if available, to verify eligibility. Additional documentation may be required. **While supplies last or until capacity is reached.**
- **Healthcare Navigation (CHPW) 11:00am - 2:00pm (Sept 1st & 15th)**
Representative available to assist individuals seeking healthcare coverage, answer inquiries regarding Medicaid coverage and resolve CHPW plan concerns.
- **Behavioral Health/Supportive Svcs. (Helping Hands Project Org.) 11:00am - 1:00pm**
Agency offers support for individuals facing mental health challenges and/or substance abuse. Services include intensive case management, housing assistance BH counseling, and more. *Eligibility criteria must be met to access service.*
- **Employment Navigation (Orion) 11:30am-1:00pm (Sept 8th & 22nd)**
Individualized employment services to support eligible individuals overcome barriers in obtaining and maintaining employment.
- **VOAWW Connect (VOA) 12:00pm-2:00pm**
Individuals can meet with a Community Resource Advocate from VOAWW Connect who will assess their needs and match them with available services in their area.
- **Peer Recovery Support (Ideal Option/NSACH) 12:30pm - 2:30pm (Sept 8th & 22nd)**
Provides individuals with SUD access to resources and help to develop action plans to address identified needs. Services include intensive case management from a lived perspective.
- **PATH Outreach Program (Bridgeways) 1:00pm - 3:00pm**
PATH supports individuals experiencing homelessness with serious mental illness and/or substance use disorders by using a Housing First approach to help them secure stable housing and build a foundation for recovery and long-term stability.
