Coordinated Entry

A system for individuals and families experiencing or at imminent risk of homelessness

Access the Coordinated Entry system by calling
VOA Connect at 360-VOA-HELP

Who is eligible?

Individuals or families experiencing literal or imminent homelessness are eligible for Coordinated Entry.

Literally homeless: A person who is sleeping outside, in a shelter, or somewhere not meant for human habitation. Persons who are literally homeless will be referred to a Resource Navigator.

Imminently homeless: A person who will be losing the housing they currently have in 14 days or less. Persons who are imminently homeless will be referred to a Prevention Navigator.

A Navigator will receive the referral from VOA Connect and contact you to set up an appointment.



Eligible households can access Coordinated Entry for homeless prevention and housing assistance through uniform screening, assessment, and prioritization. Support is provided to access resources and to develop action plans to address identified needs. Immediate housing resources are limited.

Frequently Asked Questions

Can I use Coordinated Entry to get immediate placement into a housing program?

Unfortunately, no. There are very limited Snohomish County housing programs available for those who need it. Many community housing resources are not filled through Coordinated Entry. These include emergency shelter, affordable housing, senior and disabled housing,

Section 8 programs, and chemical dependency treatment-based housing programs.

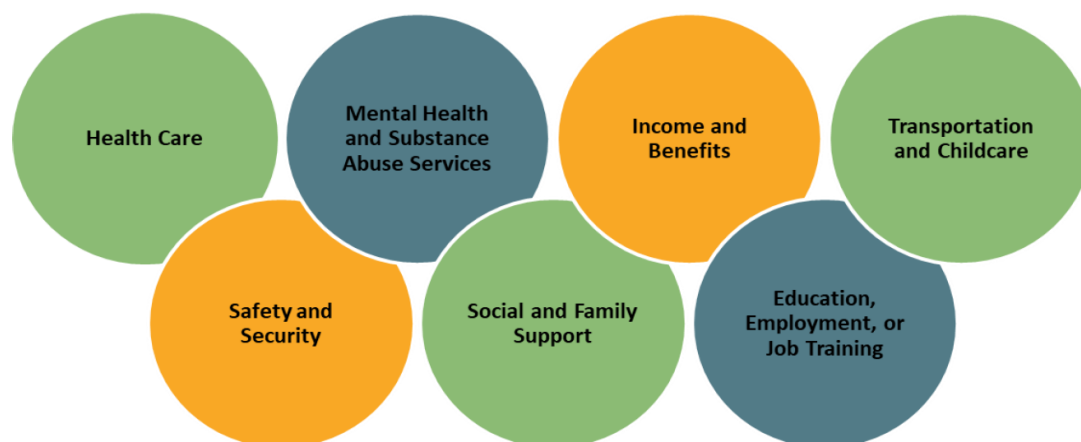
Coordinated Entry will allow you to meet with a Navigator to determine whether you are eligible for specific housing programs and other possible resources and housing solutions.

Can a Navigator tell me how long it will take to get housing through a certain program?

No. All of the housing programs served through Coordinated Entry are NOT accessed on a “first come, first served” basis. Households are prioritized for programs based on an assessment. Some households will be placed before others, regardless of who contacts Coordinated Entry first. The best course of action is to work with your Navigator to identify solutions outside of the homeless housing system.

Do navigation services vary from agency to agency?

No. While some agencies serve specific populations, all Coordinated Entry agencies follow the same policies and procedures. All Navigators utilize the same screening tool to assess your needs. Navigators will work with you to identify and resolve barriers to housing stability by providing direct referrals to tailored services.

If you are experiencing a housing crisis, the Senior Housing Stability Program may be able to help. We will work alongside you and support you to:

- Understand what options may work for you based on your personal situation

While low-income senior housing opportunities generally have long wait lists, our staff can help you understand and navigate the various programs you may want to explore.

- In order to qualify for HEN rental assistance, you must be **currently experiencing homelessness or at risk of losing your housing 14 days or less (prevention services)**.

 - Or by visiting the nearest DSHS office
2. You must call **360-VOA-HELP (360-862-4357)** or **1-800-223-8145** to be screened for **Coordinated Entry** and be assigned a Navigator.
3. HEN staff will contact clients directly when funding allows. Keep in touch with your Navigator until contacted by HEN staff.
4. If you already have a Navigator, inform them of your HEN referral. As rental assistance funding allows, you may be contacted by HEN staff.
5. HEN staff are available **by appointment only**.

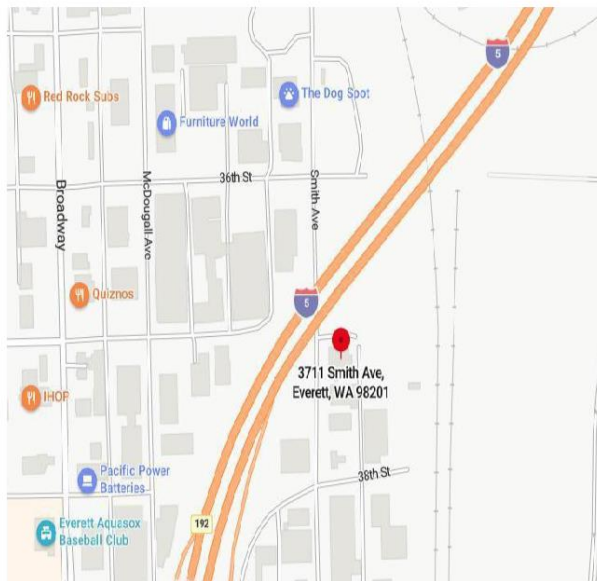

What Refugees and Other Immigrants Should Know About Maintaining or Regaining Eligibility for Federal Public Benefits

New federal law known as H.R. 1 has changed who is eligible for certain public benefits like federal medical assistance. Beginning Oct. 1, 2026, many adult immigrants who are enrolled in federal Medicaid or related supports and services through the Washington State Department of Social and Health Services will no longer qualify for these programs and be disenrolled.

Refugees, asylees and certain other immigrants might be able to maintain or regain eligibility for federal public benefit programs like Medicaid by becoming lawful permanent residents (getting a green card). Refugees are exempt from the five-year bar.

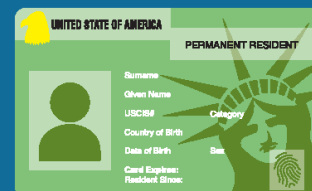

- Ukrainian Humanitarian Parolee
- Immigrant with another form of humanitarian protection

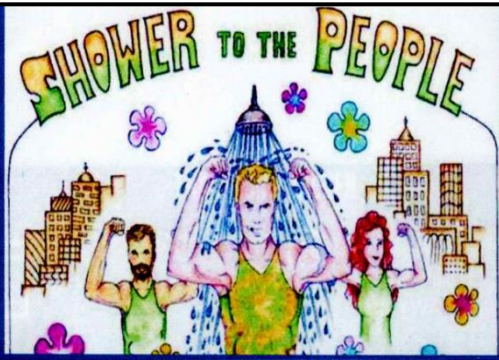

Need help moving into stable housing? Pathways to Stability provides financial assistance for security deposits and utility deposits to help individuals and families secure permanent housing and avoid homelessness.

What can we help with?

- Refundable Security deposits for rental units.
- Utility deposits (electric, water, gas, etc.)

Who may qualify?

You may be eligible if you:

- Are homeless or at imminent risk of homelessness with a notice from your landlord.
- Have identified housing or are actively searching.
- Have not signed a lease yet (inspection of the unit is required prior to lease signing)
- Meet income guidelines (typically low-income households)
- Are able to maintain housing costs. Rent cannot exceed 40% of your household's monthly gross income.

The Lifeline program is a federal program that helps lower the monthly cost of your phone or internet service.

What are the program benefits?

- You can get a survivor benefit for up to six months:
- Up to **\$9.25/month** on phone, internet, or bundled service
- Up to **\$34.25/month** if you live on qualifying Tribal lands

What do you need to know before applying as a survivor?

- You will need to provide documentation of an attempted line separation request, which you can get from your phone company
- You will be able to select how you want us to reach out to you
- Only a limited group of representatives will have access to your information

How can I qualify?

You can qualify through the survivor-specific criteria:

- If your household income is at or below **200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines** (for example, \$64,303 for a family of four)

 - Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC)
 - Free and Reduced-Price School Lunch or School Breakfast Program, including enrollment at a Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) school or school district
 - Received a Federal Pell Grant in the current award year

You can also qualify through the standard Lifeline criteria:

- If your household income is at or below **135% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines** (for example, \$43,403 for a family of four)

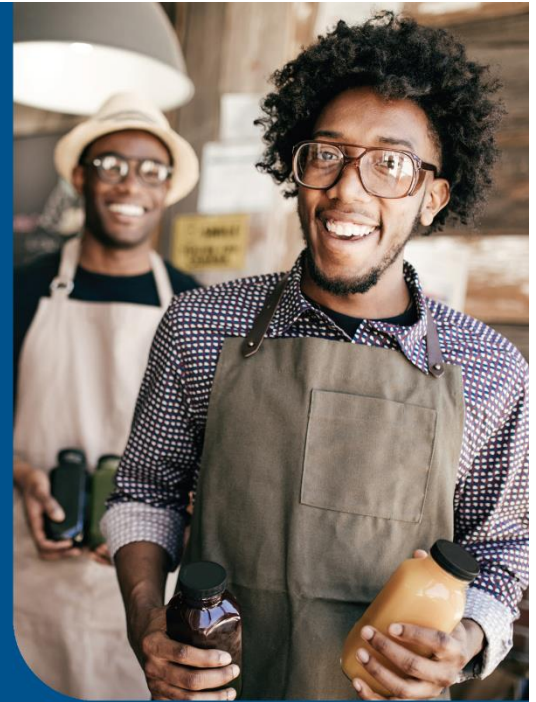

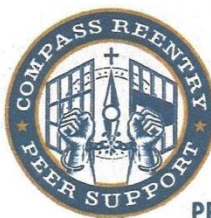

We have members who drank only on occasion, those who casually referred to themselves as drunks, and others who were full-blown alcoholics. Lots of us used a wide variety of mind-altering substances. Whether we focused on a specific substance or used whatever we could get our hands on, we had one thing in common: eventually we all reached a point where we could not stop.

We are a Fellowship of addicts who meet together to share our hope, faith, and courage for the purpose of staying sober and helping others achieve the same freedom. Everything heard at our meetings is to be treated as confidential. There are no dues or fees of any kind. To be a member, you only have to want to quit. We also exchange phone numbers, and give and seek support from one another between meetings.
